During his time as Superintendent at Garaway, he guided the District to 6 Excellent ratings on the State Report Card. He also led design and fund raising for a renovation project for Garaway Athletic the Complex which included a new all weather track, new

home bleachers, and the Garaway Belden Center. All funds for these projects were donated.
