A. A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT THE SINGLE QUESTION OF LEVYING AN ADDITIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT INCOME TAX FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND ISSUING SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$32,250,000, PURSUANT TO SECTION 5748.08 OF THE REVISED CODE.

WHEREAS, to address significant current and on-going operating and facilities needs of the School District, and pursuant to Section 5748.08 of the Revised Code and as provided in this Resolution, this Board has determined to submit to the electors of the School District, at an election to be held on November 5, 2013, a single proposal consisting of the question of (i) levying an additional tax on the taxable income of individuals as defined in Section 5748.01(E)(1)(b) of the Revised Code for current expenses and (ii) issuing bonds for the purpose stated in Section 2 and levying a tax to pay debt charges on such bonds and any securities issued in anticipation thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Garaway Local School District, Counties of Tuscarawas, Coshocton and Holmes, Ohio, $\frac{2}{3}$ of all members elected thereto concurring, that:

Section 1. Declaration of Necessity of School District Income Tax. This Board finds, determines and declares that it is necessary to raise the additional amount of \$1,400,000 annually for school district purposes (specifically, current expenses) by levying an additional tax on the taxable income of individuals as defined in Section 5748.01(E)(1)(b) of the Revised Code.

Section 2. Declaration of Necessity of Bonds. This Board further finds, determines and declares that it is necessary to issue general obligation bonds of the School District in the aggregate principal amount of \$32,250,000 for the purpose of constructing, adding to, renovating, remodeling, furnishing, equipping and otherwise improving school district buildings and facilities and acquiring, clearing, improving and equipping their sites (the Bonds), and to levy a tax outside of the ten-mill limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution to pay the debt charges on the Bonds and any anticipatory securities. The maximum number of years over which the principal of the Bonds may be paid is 37 years, and the Bonds will be dated approximately January 1, 2014, and will bear interest at a rate now estimated at 4.25% per year, payable semiannually.

Section 3. Submission of Single Question to the Electors. Accordingly, this Board finds, determines and declares that it is necessary to submit to the electors of the School District, at an election to be held in the School District on November 5, 2013, the single question of the school district income tax described in Section 1 and the issuance of the Bonds and levy of the tax to pay debt charges described in Section 2, pursuant to Section 5748.08 of the Revised Code.

Section 4. Certification and Delivery of Resolution to State Tax Commissioner. The Treasurer of this Board is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the State Tax Commissioner before the close of business on July 23, 2013, and this Board hereby requests the Commissioner to estimate and certify to it both (i) the property tax rate that would have to be imposed by the School District in the current year to produce an amount equivalent to the amount specified in Section 1 from an additional ad valorem property tax and (ii) the school district income tax rate that would have had to have been in effect for the current year to produce an amount equivalent to the amount specified in Section 1 from a school district income tax on the taxable income of individuals as defined in Section 5748.01(E)(1)(b) of the Revised Code.

Section 5. Certification and Delivery of Resolution to County Auditor. The Treasurer of this Board is also directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Tuscarawas County Auditor before the close of business on July 23, 2013, and, in accordance with Sections 5705.03 and 5748.08 of the Revised Code, this Board hereby requests the County Auditor to certify to it (i) the total current tax valuation of the School District and (ii) the estimated average annual property tax rate, expressed in dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation and in mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, that the County Auditor estimates to be required throughout the stated maturity of the Bonds to pay debt charges on the Bonds, assuming that they are all issued in one series bearing interest and maturing in substantially equal principal amounts in each year over the maximum number of years over which the principal of the Bonds may be paid, both as stated in Section 2, and that the amount of the tax valuation of the School District for the current year

(or, if that amount is not determined, the estimated amount of that tax valuation submitted by the County Auditor to the County Budget Commission) remains the same throughout the maturity of the bonds (except as otherwise provided in Section 133.18(C)(2) of the Revised Code).

Section 6. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 7. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.

The Garaway Team of 25 to 30 students will travel approximately 305 miles by Pioneer Trails Charter Bus making one stop on the way for dinner in Ann Arbor and will stay overnight Thursday night at the Holliday Inn Express near the University. The students will be able to watch the college meet and all varsity runners will run in various races throughout the day. Expected arrival back at the school will be Saturday morning between 2 and 3 a.m.
