Identify Critical Needs

Briefly describe the process used to identify the critical needs associated with the Wellness and Success initiative.

We have identified ongoing mental health needs within our district with local information and added appropriate services. Some of these services were added previously but were funded through a separate grant opportunity.

Additionally, we identified critical needs by using the data available through the 2018 Tuscarawas County Community Health Status Assessment. This community health assessment was cross-sectional and included a written survey of adults and adolescents within Tuscarawas County. From the beginning, community leaders were actively engaged in the planning process and helped define the content, scope, and sequence of the study. Two survey instruments were designed and pilot-tested for this study: one for adults and one for adolescents in grades 6-12. As a first step in the design process, health education researchers from the University of Toledo and staff members from HCNO met to



discuss potential sources of valid and reliable survey items that would be appropriate for assessing the health status and health needs of adults and adolescents. The investigators decided to derive the majority of the adult survey items from the BRFSS, and the majority of the adolescent survey items from the YRBSS. This decision was based on being able to compare local data with state and national data.
